### Scripture Lessons

*Job 38:1-40:4* (*excerpts*). <sup>38:1</sup>Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind: <sup>2</sup>"Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? <sup>3</sup>Gird up your loins like a man, I will question you, and you shall declare to me.

<sup>4</sup>"Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. <sup>5a</sup>Who determined its measurements—surely you know! [...] <sup>6b</sup>Who laid its cornerstone <sup>7</sup>when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy? [...] <sup>12</sup>Have you commanded the morning since your days began, and caused the dawn to know its place? [...] <sup>25</sup>Who has cut a channel for the torrents of rain, and a way for the thunderbolt, <sup>26</sup>to bring rain on a land where no one lives, on the desert, which is empty of human life? Other boats were with him. <sup>37</sup>A great windstorm arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. <sup>38</sup>But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" <sup>39</sup>He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. <sup>40</sup>He said to them, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?" <sup>41</sup>And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"


# It's Shelter Sunday - Happy Father's Day!


# God of the Sparrow God of the Whale
