



Camerata Piano Trio concerts will offer Mozart, Brahms, and Kreisler favorites in Lebanon & Norwich

Camerata's young cello & violin students will play for Lebanon audience

The Camerata New England Piano Trio will play much-loved chamber music classics by Mozart and Brahms and will delight audiences with three pieces by violin virtuoso Fritz Kreisler when they perform in Lebanon and Norwich on October 22 and 23.

The two concerts mark Camerata's return to performing for live audiences since the pandemic made in-person concerts impossible. Camerata New England's nationally and internationally known musicians have been bringing extraordinary chamber music to our region since 2009.

The concert on **Saturday, October 22, at 7:00 pm**, will be held at **First Congregational Church of Lebanon**, 10 South Park Street, Lebanon, NH. In addition to the professional trio's performance, a group of 15 Mt. Lebanon & Hanover Street Elementary school students, 2nd through 5th graders, will open the program with a mini concert.

The concert on **Sunday, October 23, at 2:00 pm**, will be held at **Norwich Congregational Church**, 15 Church Street, on the Norwich Green.

Tickets are \$28 (cash only) at the door. There is no charge for attendees who are 18 or younger.

The Camerata Piano Trio musicians are Hannah Shields, piano; Omar Chen-Güey, violin; and Linda Galvan, cello. They will perform the Mozart Trio in B flat Major, three selections by Kreisler, and the Brahms Piano Trio in C Major.

Camerata New England is a non-profit organization devoted to "Performing, Teaching, Inspiring," which accepts donations and grants to cover the cost of the Camerata Strings Program for Upper Valley public school students. Students are provided with cellos or violins of an appropriate size, and all lessons are free of charge.
