
PASTORAL CARE: SOME ASSUMPTIONS

- Pastoral care is a vocational activity, i.e., it is something to which we are called
- Pastoral care should not be something done only by the pastor
- Pastoral care can be a joy to provide but it can also be demanding
- Pastoral care is fundamental to the life of the Christian community
- Different situations require different types of pastoral care

WHAT IS A MULTI-TIERED APPROACH?

- A multi-tiered approach recognizes that different situations require different kinds and levels of pastoral care
- Situations might be:
 - Critical
 - Chronic
 - Sad
 - Joyful
- Situations might involve:
 - Death
 - Illness
 - Job loss
 - Pregnancy
 - Other ...

HOW ARE THE LAITY ORGANIZED?

At First Congregational Church of Lebanon ...

- Diaconate
- Called to Care/C2C
- Prayer Team
- Ad Hoc

WHO DOES WHAT?

- Pastor Through visits, consultations and regular communication, provides intensive pastoral care, deals directly with crisis situations in addition to general care
- Diaconate responsible for overall spiritual welfare of fellow parishioners
- C2C provides ongoing pastoral care through visits, prayers, calls, and emails to individuals on C2C and TLC lists
- Prayer Team prays for those on C2C list in addition to others brought to their attention
- Ad Hoc responds to unique situations as necessary (e.g. Hurricane Irene)

COMMUNICATION IS KEY!



C2C: WHO'S ON THE LIST?

- People in crisis situation, usually health-related
- People with ongoing, chronic condition
- Families approaching death of a loved one

C2C: WHAT DOES IT DO?

- Visit, call, email, send cards to people on C2C list
- Prepare meals when appropriate
- Take people to doctor, on errands, as appropriate

THE TLC LIST

- For those who have come off the C2C list or might be added at a future date
- Usually elderly members of congregation
- Good way to anticipate situations requiring more intensive pastoral care

ORGANIZATION

- C2C has coordinator, who confers on a regular basis with the pastor
- Each of the ten members is "on call" for one week
- Cultivate leadership serving as coordinator is rewarding but can be draining
- At FCC, C2C is a responsibility of the Diaconate C2C and Deacons should communicate regularly

PRAYER TEAM

- Works in conjunction with and in addition to C2C
- Prayer concerns can be offered by anyone in the congregation or wider community

- Community partnerships
- Parish Nurse
- Other ...
