**Brian Jones** is Director of the Copley Singers, a Boston-based semi-professional choir, and is this winter and spring serving as Visiting Artist at Christ Church Cathedral, Lexington, Kentucky. He is Emeritus Director of Music & Organist at Trinity Church, Boston, where he served from 1984–2004 and built a program that attracted wide acclaim. Since 2004, he has filled several interim positions, at The Cathedral Church of St John, Albuquerque, New Mexico, Old South Church in Boston, and as Interim Associate Organist at Harvard Memorial Church in Cambridge. He was head of the music department at Noble & Greenough School in Dedham, MA for twenty years, Director of the Dedham Choral Society for 27 years, Director of Music at Wellesley Village Congregational Church for ten years, and has performed widely through the United States, England, Mexico, Bermuda, and Canada as an organ solo artist or guest conductor. A graduate of Oberlin and Boston University, he has taught at many workshops and conferences, and has been heard on NPR, the BBC and many other media venues. His recordings, as organ concert artist and as Director of the Trinity Choir, are on the London-Polygram, Dorian, Gothic, Arkay and AFKA labels.

He lives in Boston, and in his spare time enjoys visiting with friends, reading, exercising, sailing, travel, history, and driving his antique car, “Lydia,” a 1933 Chrysler Royal 8 Rumble Seat Coupe.

**Bruce Adami** is Organist of Christ Church, Exeter, NH, and previously served at Brookside UCC in Manchester. He is a graduate of Oberlin Conservatory and has performed in many parts of New England as an organist and pianist. He also teaches piano and organ in Exeter, and lives in Deerfield, MA.
