COMMITTEE NOTES

DIACONATE

At the July-August meeting of the Diaconate on July 27, Steve Silver reported that **Praise in the Park** was a huge success, with 149 in attendance. Steve and his clergy colleagues are discussing **more opportunities for ecumenical worship**. While not possible this summer, pulpit exchanges are being considered for next year.

Steve will be leading a memorial service for longtime FCC member **Ginee Hough** at Ricker Funeral Home at 11:00 am on August 15, with a reception following at FCC. He also offered a **pastoral care** update on Pete Mason and his family, the Dubies, and Nancy Laren. He also reported that he is contemplating a **cancer ministry**, and the congregation is invited to share thoughts about this ministry with him.

Steve will be taking two weeks of vacation at the end of August until Labor Day. In his absence, Kevin Schwartz of Christ Redeemer Church in Hanover will preach on August 30, and Heidi Hoskin will be in the pulpit September 6. Greg Marshall will preach here on September 27, so that Steve can participate in the Horton Center retreat. He also plans to take study leave in San Jose Villanueva in November. Following up on Hilary Ryder's recent sermon on the socalled BDS movement, Steve offered to articulate his own position on this issue in the future.

The Deacons also discussed two events planned for next month. On Sunday, September 20, the FCC Outing Club will hike on Balch Hill, led as always by Ron Bailey. The following weekend (September 25-27) is our annual church retreat at the UCC Horton Center in the White Mountains. The entire congregation is welcome to participate in both events; please look for further information soon.

The church has voted to join the United Valley Interfaith Project (UVIP). Ron Bailey and Steve Teeter are our representatives in this important alliance of area faith communities and service organizations. UVIP will again recognize local "Micah Heroes" this fall, and church members are invited to submit up to three nominations to the church office by Monday, August 24.

The church has an agreement with Lifetouch Photography **to produce a new church directory.** Two dates will be offered for photo shoots— Wednesday, October 28 (2-9pm), and Saturday, November 14 (10am-5pm). Congregation members will be able to sign up for times online, and all photos will be available for individual purchase. More details will follow in September.

Considering their collective worship responsibilities, the Deacons shared their views on our practice of presenting monthly communion by intinction. All spoke to the merits of this format. In November the Deacons will lead Sunday afternoon worship services in teams of two at Genesis. Bulletins and hymn booklets will be provided.

Call for Nominations — 4th Annual Micah Awards Sponsored by the United Valley Interfaith Project (UVIP)

The prophet Micah calls us to consider what it means to live into God's expectations for us, offering guidance on how to live up to those expectations: "And what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (*Micah* 6:8)

UVIP's Micah Awards annually recognize local "Micah Heroes" who live into the prophet's words in some exemplary manner—people who contribute abundant time and energy to community service, who consistently volunteer to work for a vital cause, who offer us a living role model of faith in service. As FCC joins UVIP as a full member, we are invited to choose our congregation's Micah Hero.

All are welcome to nominate up to three members of our congregation who best represent the spirit of the Micah Awards (only last year's winner, Ron Bailey, is ineligible). The individual who receives the most votes will be our congregation's Micah Hero for 2015. Please keep in mind that this is an annual award, so nominations typically reflect service during the previous year (next year's Micah Hero will be someone new, and many will have an opportunity for this recognition).
