The Pastoral Perspective

As I write this, the Lebanon fire station is being demolished, part of the project to build a new facility that will serve our community and keep our firefighters safe.

Some of you may know that my predecessor, the Rev. Richard Slater, served as chaplain to the department. After I arrived at FCC, I visited the department to offer my services but learned that the firefighters had a volunteer from within their ranks who served as chaplain. I'm glad they recognized the importance of that function.

Richard also celebrated the wedding of one of the firefighters, a fact I learned as I talked with two retirees from the department who stood on our front steps to watch the station's demolition (*see pg. 4*). I had been in the Sanctuary to see if any cracks had appeared as a result of the work (as yet, none have), and while there, I heard an insistent knocking on the front door. I investigated and found our retirees—along with a FedEx driver, who didn't know how to reach our back entrance.

After dealing with the delivery situation, the former firefighters and I talked about their memories, including Richard Nixon's visit to our church in March 1989. From their perch on the side of the station, they watched the former president arrive for the funeral of his friend, the late Senator Norris Cotton, a member of our congregation. It is Mr. Cotton's former home that now serves as the church parsonage.

There's a lot of history here. Along with Senator Cotton, Governor Lane Dwinell worshiped at our church. Today, we have no bold-name politicians at First Congregational, but we do have a hard-working state representative who sings in our choir.

Whether our congregation's political makeup has shifted or stayed the same over the years, as our political parties have changed, is a discussion for another day. What has stayed the same is that we all respect one another and our views. I pray that this will remain true long into the future, that what unites us—our desire to follow the path of Jesus Christ—will always carry more weight than our disagreements over matters of public policy.



Church St Closed! Fire Station Going, Going...

As work crews demolish and clear Lebanon's 1954 fire station to make way for its new facility, the northern end of Church Street is now closed, from South Park Street to the entrance of FCC's parking lot, until at least the fall of 2025. Access to our lot is possible *only* via detours along Water and Valley Streets or Spring Street. Thanks for your patience during the closure!



All church members, friends, and/or dogs are invited to share this experience of God's creation!




